Barossa Valley

It has world famous wines, more than 60 cellar doors, art galleries and friendly cafés, the Barossa Valley is the perfect place to unwind, just over an hour from Adelaide. Once you have uncovered what the region is famous for, explore the historic villages, browse the museums and antique stores, stroll through the Lyndoch Lavender Farm, or enjoy a round of golf. You may never want to leave.

Clare Valley

Offering a quaint rural location with lovingly restored towns, the Clare Valley is ideal for experiencing genuine country hospitality. Follow the 300 kilometre drive along the Heartland Heritage Trail to experience the living traditions, hire a bicycle or explore the towns by foot, there are a number of nature walks, bushland and country roads awaiting discovery. With a sensational wine list, no visit would be complete without visiting the cellar doors, where you are likely to meet the winemaker.

Kangaroo Island

Stunning coastal scenery, amazing rock formations, incredible wildlife, forests and farmlands, this is the place to get back to nature. See a colony of sea lions at Seal Bay, fur seals at Cape du Couedic in Flinders National Park and spot little penguins from Kingscote or Penneshaw. Dine on fresh seafood and taste locally produced wines, cheeses and honey. Accessible by ferry from Cape Jervis or by plane from Adelaide, you can visit for a day or stay on the island to thoroughly explore its natural beauty.

Flinders Ranges

Bushwalk through the Flinders Ranges national parks and discover gorges that are millions of years old. Climb Mount Remarkable in the Southern Flinders Ranges, walk through Wirrabara and Bundaleer forests, or taste the local flavours on the Southern Flinders flavours trail. Discover the sheer magnificence of Wilpena Pound, take a scenic flight for the best view and experience the gateway to the Outback in the Northern Flinders Ranges with dramatic mountain peaks, vibrant red earth, and brilliant blue skies.

Outback

South Australia's Outback is a fascinating mix of breathtaking landscapes and intriguing characters. Coober Pedy is one of the world's leading opal producers and is a captivating town where more than half of the population reside underground. Overnight in an underground hotel or join the famous Outback Mail Run to Oodnadatta and William Creek. Admire the stunning natural landscape, try your luck at opal digging and learn the history of this alluring region.
